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Message from Mrs Collis



I hope you all had a very happy Christmas and a restful break and enjoyed spending time with families and friends. Thank you for all your support in what was a busy but productive term. I would like to wish you all a very Happy New Year. It has been great to see all the children back, ready for another happy and productive spring term.

It was fantastic to see so many of you at the Christmas celebrations at the end of term. The Nursery team put together a lovely 'Nursery Sing a Long', it was really well attended by parents/carers, grandparents and siblings. The children looked fantastic dressed as snowmen (with a special painted hat!) and sang their songs very confidently.

Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 performed, 'A Little Bird Told Me.' The singing sounded fantastic and all the children spoke their lines with confidence.

Year 3/4 children and the children from the Language Unit class performed a 'Christmas Carol.' We had packed audiences and I was very impressed with the confidence the children demonstrated when delivering the large number of lines and how confidently the children knew the songs.

Year 5/6 children and the children from Mr Perry's class performed 'Could it be Christmas.' Once again there were packed audiences and we all enjoyed the mix of dancing, singing, reindeer rapping and word association. It sounded fantastic when all the children joined together for a number of songs.

I am sure you will join me in thanking all of the staff involved in these fantastic events, for their hard work and commitment. Thanks to parents, carers, grandparents, siblings and friends for attending, and for such positive feedback about all of the events, they were a great way to end the term and start Christmas.

There have been a number of charity events recently, I am pleased to be able to let you know that we raised £467.59 for Children in Need, £123.80 on Christmas Jumper Day for Save the Children, and we collected the following amounts for the charities which the School Council chose following the performances; Age UK, Lewes - £181.85, Citizen Advice, Lewes - £149.98 and Martletts, Lewes - £180.99. Thank you for your generosity. In addition, thank you for all the contributions to the reverse advent calendar, there was a big box of food that was taken to the Food Bank at Landport.

Thanks to all parents/carers who have signed up to the ParentPay, the cashless scheme we have launched to pay for school dinners. If you have not yet signed up to ParentPay please can you do so as soon as possible using the log in details you have been sent. If you have any queries or would like help with this please ask at reception. It is important all families are signed up to ParentPay as it will be used for school trips and other payments in the future.

Slide and woodchip area

You will have noticed that over the holiday the slide has been completed and the fencing has now been removed as the area is ready to be used. This is fantastic news and the children enjoyed playing in the woodchip area yesterday. Please could I ask that before and after school you supervise your children whilst they use the slide and ensure they follow the rules of the slide, which will be shared with all of the classes on Monday. Children should go down the slide one at a time and not slide on the rails, they should not run up the slide. Children should access the slide by the steps and not via the mound. It is particularly important at the moment that children do not climb up the mound as the grass seed is just starting to grow. Thanks for your help with this.

Over the Christmas holidays the Year 6 classrooms were both painted, with money donated by Friends of Wallands, they now look fantastic and were a nice surprise for the classes in January.

We are awaiting the arrival of two noticeboards for the playgrounds, also funded by Friends of Wallands, this will allow notices and important information to be more easily shared with parents/carers. Many thanks to Friends of Wallands for this funding, we really appreciate the money that has allowed us to invest in these aspects.

Governors meet most months and have responsibility for overseeing the school's finances, holding the senior team to account for how well the children are learning and for making sure we have a clear and effective vision and strategy. At a time of potential change and with the Board looking at all the options for partnerships, including a Lewes multi-academy trust, this is a great moment to bring your voice to the decision-making process!

School Council – Nic Perry

The School Council were very busy last term. They meet every Thursday from 2:30 to 3:10pm. Each class from Year 1 to Year 6 and the Language Unit have an elected member. There is also a press team who attend meetings in order to write articles for the school’s newsletter.

School Council have discussed how best to team up the school values with charter stars. There were lots of good ideas shared and a lot of discussion on how to make the proposed system fair. School Council agreed a final proposal which was explained to Fiona Large (Deputy Head) and will go to the Senior Leadership Team meeting next week.

School Council took part in a food tasting with kitchen staff to evaluate and rate new dishes for the school menu. These evaluations were sent to Chartwells to feed into their research.



The School Council researched charities that monies from the collections of the Christmas Shows could be donated to. After a period of research council members had to pitch their chosen charity. Following all the pitches a vote took place and three charities were selected. They were: Martlets in Lewes, Citizens Advice Bureau, Lewes and Age UK, Lewes. School Council members collected donations after each Christmas performance.

In addition to this council members have made suggestion boxes where children can write to the school council with questions, queries or ideas. These will form part of the agenda moving forward.

Reception and KS1 news -Kim Hart, Foundation Stage and KS1 Leader

The children enjoyed taking part in the Christmas concert, they took on the parts of angels. This was the first experience of performing to a large crowd for many children. They took it all in their stride and enjoyed the fun. Lots of parents said how much they enjoyed seeing their children on the stage alongside KS1 children.

The end of term was celebrated with a traditional Christmas party. This included a range of games and of course party food.

The children have now returned from their holidays full of enthusiasm and ready to learn. This term Reception will begin thinking about the New Year and what we hope it will bring. We are linking this to our aspiration branch of our School Charter.

The children have expressed a keen interest in 'Space and Space Travel', and so we've decided to take the topic in their chosen direction. We will look at a variety of non-fiction and fiction books to support this topic.

In Year 1, the children have started a new topic focused around the brilliant story – Jim and the Beanstalk by Raymond Briggs. They will be writing their own stories and building some giant bean stalks. In Year 2, the children have started their topic called Wild Things. They will be finding out and writing about nocturnal animals and their habitats.

KS2 News – Fiona Large, Deputy Head, KS2 Leader

In KS2, children are starting exciting new topics.

In Year 3, the children have begun to explore the classic Anglo-Saxon myth of Beowulf. They will learn about life in Saxon and Viking times, exploring why they settled in Britain and the legacy of the invasions.

In Year 4, the children are really looking forward to finding out about life as a Roman soldier as well as the fascinating story of Pompeii. They will find out through reading the text Escape from Pompeii by Christina Ballit.

In Year 5, Ancient Greece is the topic for this term. The children will explore the origins of the Olympic games as well as the legacy of Ancient Greece. In English, the children will be exploring myths and legends and reading Who let the gods out by Maz Evans – a very funny novel about Greek Gods.

In Year 6, the topic is survival and the children will explore stories of survival in different environments. In English, they will be reading the fantastic novel The Explorer by Katherine Rundell.

Language Unit News – Nic Perry, Language Unit Leader

Term 2 was a very busy but exciting term. Mr Perry's class went to Brighton Museum to visit the two Ancient Egyptian rooms followed by a workshop where they mummified a body and re-enacted the journey to the underworld.

Both classes, thanks to the Golden Lion Trust, went to Sheffield Park Bluebell Railway Station and caught the Santa Express. On board, there were magicians, musicians and singers. Best of all was when two elves followed by Santa came through the train giving out presents and chatting to all the children. Afterwards the children got chance to go in the steam engine and signal box as well as doing many activities in the museum. It really was a magical trip.

Both classes have also been involved in the Year 3/4 and Year 5/6 Christmas productions in which they did a great job and made so many very proud.

Junior Choir

The Junior Choir were busy before Christmas and performed on Sunday December 9th at the New Sussex Singers *Sing Noel!* Concert at St Anne's Church, Lewes. They also performed on Saturday 15th December at the East Sussex Community Choir Christmas Concert in aid of Sussex Dementia at Lewes Town Hall. During both events the children were superb ambassadors for the school and gave fantastic performances during both evenings. They performed alone but also as part of the adult choir.

On behalf of all the children and the school I wanted to thank Briony Lambert for her fabulous direction and leadership of the choir. Briony worked so hard with the choir in the lead up to the events, preparing them thoroughly, inspiring them to sing and giving them access to fantastic singing opportunities to be involved in.

In the last week of term the choir were chosen for a Hot Chocolate with Mrs Newman, along with Briony for all their amazing singing at Christmas concerts.

Attendance Matters

Our focus on attendance is to ensure we meet our **target** for the year of **96% or above**, this is an achievable target if we all work in partnership. At the end of December our overall attendance figure was 94%, so our focus will continue as we go into the Spring term.

We believe passionately that every school day matters in a child's education. This is backed up by plenty of research to show how crucial regular attendance is in ensuring children reach their full potential in our education system and develop into confident, well- rounded adults who are equipped for life.

How do we deal with persistent absence?

We like to keep parents informed about their child's attendance will provide termly reports for every child

from Reception upwards where attendance is an issue. We make contact with parents of children whose attendance is a cause for concern. Children are considered to have persistent absence if attendance falls below 90%. The purpose of phone calls or meetings is to identify the reasons for persistent absence and to identify any support the school or outside agencies can give to ensure the child's attendance improves. Currently we have 61 children who are identified as having persistent absence, i.e. whose termly percentage falls below 90%.

In rare cases, where there is significant and ongoing concern about a child's attendance, the school has a legal obligation to refer the matter to the Education Support Behaviour and Attendance Service (**ESBAS**).

What do I do if my child is absent from school?

Parents have a responsibility to inform the school if their child is absent and provide a valid reason for the absence. We encourage parents either to ring the school (01273 472776) or contact us by email (office@wallandscp.e-sussex.sch.uk) as early as possible **ON THE FIRST DAY OF ABSENCE**, and every day after that.

Lateness

It is really important that children are in school on time, as children who arrive late are greatly disadvantaged because they miss starting the day with their peers and the beginning of lessons. There have recently been a number of incidents of children routinely arriving at school at 9.00 a.m. or later. The school gates open at 8.40 a.m., and doors are opened at 8.50 a.m. for children to enter the building, children should be in class by 8.55 a.m. every day so that they can start their lessons promptly. It is essential that you ensure that your child arrives at school on time to prevent disruption to your child's own learning and that of others.

We are required to monitor children's punctuality and attendance. On-going lateness (after the class register has been taken) is classified as an unauthorised absence. We understand that there may be rare occasions when you are unavoidably late due to unforeseen circumstances. On these occasions please make sure that you contact the school office to inform us when you will arrive.

Just a reminder that the gates are closed each day at 9 a.m. and the Nursery gate is closed at 9.10 a.m.

What can I do as a parent?

- ensure that your child arrives at school on time each day;
- ensure that your child only misses school for reasons which are unavoidable or justified;
- always notify the school as soon as possible about your child's absence – on the first morning;
- avoid booking family holidays during term-time;
- talk to the school if you are concerned that your child may be reluctant to go to school.

Judo Celebration
